The Society was founded in Bologna on the 21st of April 2006 from the willingness of a group of professionals that, thanks to their expertise and cultural awareness, developed within the National Healthcare System, has recognized the need to further develop the fragmented network of skilled people and technological knowhow within the healthcare sector. The expansion of the above-mentioned network comprised of architects, engineers and technicians working all in the public and private healthcare sector.

Starting from the period between 80-90's these associations have worked closely not only with architectural and engineering consultancies but also with those who have decided to identify themselves into a scientific community rather than a hardly recognizable union. This differs from what currently happens with the FeNATO, another Italian founding association together with the other IFHE international associations.

The SIAIS aims to promulgate and develop in Italy the engineering culture pertaining to the design of Health-care facilities. In order to achieve this SIAIS commit themselves to a number of activities such as congresses and technical seminars some of which are organized directly in-house.



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The SIAIS counts 1.000 people already affiliated (registered and supporter).

The SIAIS recognizes the person of Eng. Marcello Fiorenza, a founding member of SIAIS, Scientific Secretary and member of the directional board and in many occasions delegated (from the FeNATO too) to maintain public relationships with the IFHE-EU.





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BOLOGNA. THE CONGRESS CITY

Bologna is called “The Learned City”. This refers to its supremacy in having the oldest University in Europe. It was founded at the end of the 11th century. The history of the University can be discovered with these fascinating itineraries, visiting: the Archiginnasio Palazzo, the Anatomical Theatre, the University Collections, and the Medieval Museum.





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Bologna also excels with another unique feature: it is the city with the most porticoes in the world. In all, it has 40 kilometres of arcades that create a very special atmosphere. The city's landscape is also made up of a large number of medieval towers. The most impressive ones are the famous Two Towers: real Medieval sky-scrapers! Climbing to the top of the Asinelli Tower, with its breath-taking view, is an incredible experience.



The different historical periods can be explored in the city and its many museums.

The origins of the city are revealed by Etruscan and Roman finds preserved in the Civic Archeological Museum and in the archeological excavations of the Sala Borsa building. Splendid examples of the art of the Middle Ages and the Renaissance can be seen in museums, churches and palazzi. Sumptuous architecture and spectacular frescoes document the vital role of Baroque in this city. All the civic



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museums of Bologna are free.

The Bolognese School (of art) tradition includes very important artists: Vitale da Bologna, Francia, the Carracci family, Reni, Guercino and Crespi. However, the works of other great Italian artists can also be admired, such as paintings by Perugino, Raffaello, Parmigianino and sculptures by Nicola Pisano, Nicolò dell'Arca, Jacopo della Quercia, Michelangelo and Jean de Boulogne. One museum is dedicated to the fascinating works by the Bolognese-born painter Giorgio Morandi, one of the most important Italian artists of the 20th century.



Bologna can also boast a great musical heritage. The Teatro Comunale, the opera-house, designed by Antonio Bibiena, is one of the oldest opera-theatres in the world. In the 18th century, Bologna was the temple of music in Europe. Mozart came here to sit the exam for the admission to the Philharmonic Academy. The great composer Rossini studied and lived in Bologna. The International Museum of Music fascinatingly records the historical musical events of the city through the pieces that were part of the Padre Martini collection



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In Bologna area, world famous gems of the motor and sports car industry are manufactured, such as Ducati and Lamborghini.

Fans of racing cars and the motor industry can visit these factories and their fascinating motor museums.



One of the most appreciated features of Bologna: its cuisine. As a matter of fact, Bologna is also known as “The Fat City”. In the heart of the city, by the main square, you can find the old market with fruit and vegetable stands, bakeries, delicatessens, fishmongers and pasta shops where tagliatelle and tortellini are made. You can try this pasta in traditional restaurants and trattorias.

ETRUSCAN AND ROMAN BOLOGNA

Bologna has Etruscan origins. Villages in the area date back to the 9th Century. The Etruscan village of Felsina, on the site of Bologna, was founded during the 6th Century



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B.C. Rich Etruscan funerary sets, with precious ceramic vases, and objects of daily-life are on show in the Archeological Museum. The city was then re-founded by the Romans in 189 B.C., with the new name of Bononia. Besides the ancient Roman findings at the Archeological Museum mentioned above, it is possible to see the interesting remains of the ancient Roman Forum in Sala Borsa, a grand hall located inside the City Hall Palazzo in Piazza Maggiore.

MEDIEVAL BOLOGNA

Bologna's "Golden Age" is the Middle Ages, especially the 13th Century. Bologna was a proud independent city-state, where the first university in medieval Europe was founded. Bologna was also rich in commerce and artisan-crafts such as the production of silk. The Medieval Museum, housed in a beautiful late 15th century noble palazzo, has magnificent collections. The most unusual of these collections is the medieval sculptures showing the professors teaching the students. Walking through the city centre we see buildings dating from the age of the Commune, belonging to the world of merchants and artisans, the noble towers, and the wooden arcades of the medieval palazzi.

BOLOGNA 'LA DOTTA': HISTORY OF THE OLDEST UNIVERSITY IN EUROPE

Bologna's "Studio", founded in 1088, was the first university in Europe. In Piazza San Domenico and Piazza San Francesco we can see grandiose monuments, tombs of the most celebrated University professors (8th-9th centuries). The Medieval Museum houses this type of monuments, so characteristic of medieval Bologna, with vivid bas-reliefs showing a professor teaching an audience of students. From the 16th Century onwards a single building became the seat of all the university: the Archiginnasio Palace, a magnificent Renaissance Palazzo. Inside it there is a 17th Century Anatomy Classroom, decorated with wooden sculptures related to Medicine.



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RENAISSANCE BOLOGNA. THE LORDSHIP OF THE BENTIVOGLIO

During the 15th Century Bologna enjoyed an age of splendour under the power of a single family, the Bentivoglio, who were the city's lords and main art-patrons, like the Medici in Florence, and the Este in Ferrara. During this age the Podestà Palace in Piazza Maggiore was totally renovated, with a very classic rustic-style portico. Under the patronage of the Bentivoglio family, work was carried out inside San Giacomo church, where the Chapel was designed following Brunelleschi's novel architecture. Among the paintings by Lorenzo Costa and Francesco Francia we can admire the portraits of Giovanni II Bentivoglio and his family.

FELSINA PITTRICE. THE GREAT BOLOGNESE SCHOOL OF PAINTING

Bologna's School of Painting was at its best during the 14th Century and the 16th-17th Centuries. The Pinacoteca Nazionale houses paintings by Bolognese masters such as Vitale da Bologna, Annibale Ludovico, Agostino Carracci, Guido Reni, and Guercino, as well as masterpieces by other great Italian artists like Giotto, Perugino, Raffaello and Parmigianino. The splendour of the young Carracci's painting is at its best in the frescoes of Palazzo Magnani. In Palazzo Pepoli Campogrande there is another important painting collection, and the rooms' ceilings show mythological scenes painted in a refreshing and non-conventional style by Giuseppe Maria Crespi (end of 17th Century).

BOLOGNA'S TERRACOTTA SCULPTURE

Terracotta sculpture was an artistic tradition in Bologna and the Emilia region during the 15th- 16th Centuries. The absence of marble in this area led to sculptors using alternative materials; real masterpieces were made with terracotta, traditionally a "poor" but versatile material. The terracotta decoration of the façade of the Spirito Santo Oratory is a very fine example of the exuberance typical of northern Italian Renaissance art. The artist who reached the highest standards of expressiveness in terracotta sculpture is Nicolò dell'Arca, whose masterpieces are the Madonna on the Palazzo Comunale's façade, and the "Compianto" (the Deposition) in Santa Maria della Vita Church (late 15th Century).



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Another great master is Alfonso Lombardi. His most important works are the terracotta statues of the “Madonna Funerals” in Santa Maria della Vita Oratory, the “Compianto” (the Deposition) in Saint Peter’s Cathedral, and the Patron Saints of Bologna in the Podestà Palace (all early 16th Century).

UNDERGROUND BOLOGNA

Since recently, some interesting historical underground sites of Bologna can be visited. 1) The archeological findings of SALA BORSA, inside Palazzo Comunale in Piazza Maggiore show the remains of Bononia’s ancient Roman Forum 2) The BAGNI DI MARIO, outside one of the old city’s gates – Porta San Mamolo -: the complex is a 16th Century aqueduct built for the water supply to the Neptune Fountain in the city centre. The water cisterns and tunnels are fully visible and well preserved. 3) The TORRENTE APOSA tunnel was built from the 13th to the 19th Century, following the Aposa stream through the city centre. The tour gives visitors the chance to discover hidden aspects of the city’s life.

MUSICAL BOLOGNA

Thanks to its prestigious Music Academy, the Accademia Filarmonica, and its great music scholars like Padre Giovanni Battista Martini, Bologna became one of the most important European centres for music in the 18th Century. W. A. Mozart, at the age of 14, spent the summer of 1770 in Bologna studying for his qualifying exam at the Filarmonica Academy. Mozart’s written exam is preserved, together with very rare and precious musical texts, ancient musical instruments, and a collection of great musicians’ portraits, in the International Music Museum The Teatro Comunale, late baroque architecture by Antonio Bibiena, was opened in 1763 and is one of the oldest Opera theatres in Italy. In the 19th Century, the “Comunale” was the Italian theatre where all Wagner’s premierès were performed, in competition with “La Scala” of Milan, considered “Verdi’s theatre”. 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BOLOGNA'S CULINARY TRADITIONS AND SPECIALITIES

Bologna's cuisine is famous all over the world. The traditional making of "sfoglia", egg-pasta, is one of its "glories". Sfoglia is the base of different types of local pasta: tortellini, tortelloni, tagliatelle, and lasagne.
